As I write my fifth Grand Almoner's Appeal the summer recess in the northern hemisphere is fast becoming a memory and most of our lodges have returned to normal masonic activity. The installation of the Office-bearers in any Lodge is a time to look to the future and reflect on our successes.

Last year the Grand Master Mason decided that Lodges, Superintendencies and District Grand Lodges should be able to pursue their support for their own chosen external charities and local communities.
